En photographiant différents terrains de recherche, entre le Burkina Faso et le Ghana, dans le delta du Nil en Egypte, à la frontière entre le Mexique et les États-Unis, et sur les côtes du Vietnam, les exposant·e·s donnent à voir la diversité géographique des interactions entre trajectoires migratoires et environnement. Ces regards photographiques interrogent les notions de changement climatique et de migration, mais aussi celles de circulation, d'adaptation, d'habitation, de subsistance ou encore d'autochtonie.

*By photographing different research case studies, between Burkina Faso and Ghana, in the Nile Delta in Egypt, at the border between Mexico and the United States, and on the coasts of Vietnam, the exhibitors shed light on the geographic diversity of the interactions between migration trajectories and environment. These photographic gazes question the notions of climate change and migration, but also those of circulation, adaptation, dwelling, livelihood and indigeneity.*
